News and Updates

Math: The 5th graders investigated graphs and putting points on a coordinate plane. We then rounded mixed numbers to the nearest whole number, subtracted decimal numbers using zeros, calculated volume, and rounded decimal numbers to the nearest whole number. The 6th graders had an investigation on compound experiments, calculated mass and weight, found the perimeter of complex shapes, and played the Sign Wars Game - an algebraic addition activity.

Social Studies: This week, we looked at how the geography of Eastern Europe affects its economy. We went through a brief history of Eastern Europe dating back a couple thousand years. We examined the effects of WWI, especially focusing on the changing borders before and after the war.

Science: During the first two days of the week, we studied Newton's law of gravitation. We then reviewed all of his laws on Wednesday and tested on Thursday.
