News and Updates

Four Weeks Left: We are coming to the end of another school year very quickly! Don't let that give your child a reason to cash it in early! There is still plenty of learning left. I want the students to be jealous of the opportunities they have here at Trinity. I want them to take advantage of the resources Trinity has to offer them before the summer days kick in. We have a lot of great activities planned before the school year ends so let's stay strong to the end!

Religion: In our first Christlight lesson, God took Elijah to heaven when his work was done, and God put to death those who mocked his prophet Elisha. In our second lesson, God gave a Shunammite woman a son, allowed him to die, and then raised him to life. With a review of the Lord's Prayer on Tuesday, we finished our Faith Foundations lessons. For the rest of the year, we will be taking our Christlight Lessons in two-day segments with the second day being more of a Bible study from the lesson.

English: This week, we studied a step-by-step approach to writing a research report. There are eight steps to the approach. Next week the students will use those steps to write their own research report.

Reading: *The Wind in the Willows*: Week 1 of Literature Circles is done! It is always an exciting week. The first day of discussion was a bit awkward, but by the end of the week, I could tell they were starting to feel much more comfortable in their perspective roles.

Math: The 5th graders multiplied decimal numbers by powers of ten, found the LCM, wrote mixed numbers as improper fractions, and studied problems with no solutions and many solutions. The 6th graders looked at different real-world applications for division, multiplied and divided integers, added and subtracted mixed measures, and learned how to use unit multipliers.

Social Studies: We are all done with our textbook for the year but the learning doesn't stop there. We are exclusively doing map work for the next couple weeks. This week, we reviewed the South region of the United States.

Science: We had one of our more exciting lessons this in Science this week. Last summer, I went to a STEM seminar and was given a Light Blox Kit. The kit allows you to show how light rays bend depending on the type of lens placed in front of it. It also takes beams of red, blue, and green light and allows you to combine them to create all the other colors including white light. The kids were fascinated!
