News and Updates

Volcanoes: On Tuesday, Mr. Henning took the students into the kitchen to play with mud! Their task was to create three different types of volcanoes: cinder-cone, shield, and composite. The students were more than willing to get their hands dirty in the name of Science!

Math: The 5th graders practiced writing answers as fractions, decimals, and percents, calculated area, and added and subtracted decimal numbers. The 6th graders studied parallelograms and fraction charts, multiplied three fractions, reviewed exponents and writing decimal numbers as fractions and also writing fractions as decimal numbers.

Social Studies: We looked at the challenges Africa faces as it tries to move forward, we looked at the steps it is taking to protect the environment, and we had a skills lesson on comparing tables. This brought us to the end of the chapter. The test will be on Monday.
