Math: The 5th graders simplified improper fractions, divided by two-digit numbers, created comparative bar graphs, used estimation when dividing by two-digit numbers, and multiplied fractions by their reciprocals. The 6th graders investigated probability, studied geometric formulas, expanded notation, order of operations with exponents, classified triangles, wrote fractions as decimal numbers, and reduced units before multiplying.

Social Studies: The students continued their studied of long-lasting civilizations, traditions, and religions in East Asia. They tested on East Asia at the end of the week.

Science: We studied some chemical changes this week and then tested on the chapter today.
